

Research Awards on the Rise!



From the Vice Provost for Research and Faculty Development

Although we reported an all time high in grant awards in FY02, the news this past year is almost as good or maybe even better, depending on which way you look at it. The amount of grant awards in FY02 reached an unprecedented high partly because we were at the beginning of a five-year funding cycle for one of our major sources of grant dollars. In FY03, we attained another all time high in sponsored research dollars. As illustrated on the cover chart, awards for sponsored research almost doubled in FY02, and rose from \$239,939 in FY01 to \$1,212,923 in FY03, an increase of more than 400%. This is of particular significance because we are slowly broadening the base of faculty submitting proposals to external agencies for support.

This is also especially good news considering that this was accomplished in a national environment where the overwhelming federal R&D funds are increasingly going to research universities with demonstrated capacity for sponsored research. I am convinced that we will be able to continue to compete very well for these funds given the quality of faculty scholarship and the capacity of the Office of Academic Grants and Sponsored Research. As you will see in the articles that follow, these research grants were awarded by major federal agencies. We received an NSF research award in Biology, the first in recent years; the new Center for Youth Relationship Development received an award from NIH, also the first NIH funding in recent years; and the Center for Assistive Technology and Inclusive Education Studies (CATIES) in the School of Education received an award from the US Department of Education, also the first in USED funding in recent years.

In addition to, and probably in the long run, more important than

the financial gains we experienced this year, is the establishment of the two centers referenced above, to support and extend research at TCNJ. other centers established in FY03 to provide business and non-profit community outreach are: Small Business Development Center, located in downtown Trenton and primarily supported by funds from the US Small Business Administration: New Jersey Global Business Initiative, located in the School of Business and primarily supported by funds from the US Department of Education; and the Center for Civic and Community Engagement, still actively seeking funds from US Housing and Urban Development and other private sources and foundations.

The work of these Centers is expected to contribute significantly to our ability to continue the trend of increasing grant funding to support the mission of the institution. I must say however, that it is faculty grant proposals submitted and awarded that will make the difference. The percentage of the faculty submitting grant proposals is not quite as encouraging. In the last four years, proposals were submitted, on average, by only 9% of the faculty. I believe we have the capacity to considerably increase the percentage of faculty submitting research proposals.

The President has asked Dr. David Tiffany and me to explore ways to increase the institution's capacity for fund raising. I will be calling on some of you to get your advice and recommendations. I look forward to reporting the results back to you in our next newsletter.

One aspect of our study will involve exploring avenues for increasing support of student research on campus, as well as proposing support mechanisms that will help increase student research activity. Angela Sgroi participated in a student research

working group last year that initiated this conversation and plans to address the following issues this year: College aspirations for student research, resources needed to reach those aspirations, identification of external and College resources, establishment of summer research internship program for students, and participation in the Council for Undergraduate Research (CUR).

As we explore these ideas this year, the Office of Academic Grants and Sponsored Research will continue to provide support and guidance as you seek funding sources, prepare and submit proposals, and manage your successful grant awards. Remember, don't be strangers. We look forward to seeing and hearing from you throughout the year.

Highlights of Sponsored Research at TCNJ



Donald Lovett seeks to understand how crabs maintain the salt balance in their blood. The estuarine crab is able to tolerate exposure to a wide range of environmental salinity, from fresh water to seawater. The levels of a hormone called methyl farnesoate (MF) change in crabs when salinity changes. Dr. Lovett's current research, which is part of a collaboration with David Borst of Illinois State University and is supported by a grant from the National Science Foundation, examines how the activity of enzymes is regulated in crabs, and how changes in MF levels initiate the osmoregulatory response. This work has implications for medical research and could eventually lead to a better understanding of the human regulatory processes associated with hypertension and kidney disease.



A new Research Center was launched this fall at TCNJ. The Center for Youth Relationship Development will conduct research, develop interventions, and

educate students and professionals to improve understanding of the emotional and cognitive processes in relationships. Under the direction of Candice Feiring, internationally recognized researcher in the area of social development and childhood sexual abuse, the Center seeks to understand emotional and cognitive processes that help explain which youth with a history of victimization are likely

to develop relationship problems. Research at the Center will integrate work on the development of romantic life with that on victimization and sexuality. Dr. Feiring's research is currently being funded by a grant from the National Institutes of Mental Health.



The efficient communication of information requires systems that introduce a minimum degree of distortion. Much of Allen Katz's research effort has focused on improving the linearity of a Mach-Zehnder optical modulator to be integrated with a microchip laser currently being developed by the Mid Atlantic Research Consortium (MARC.) MARC, a consortium of Universities and Colleges in the Delaware Valley, has supported Dr. Katz's research for several years. He has also received funding from Cadence Design Systems. In addition to his work with distortion correction, Dr. Katz has ongoing research efforts in neural networks and pattern identification in the presence of noise, the development of communications aids for the handicapped, the use of the Moon as passive reflector for ex-



tended range microwave communications, and the search for extra terrestrial intelligence (SETI.)

Jay Hoffman's research bridges the gap between science and sports. Two years ago, Dr. Hoffman began collaborating with University of Pennsylvania scientists to examine the effect of muscle oxygenation on anabolic hormonal secretions following resistance training. This was the first study of its kind to investigate effects of the intensity of exercise on oxygen delivery to exercising muscle during performance, and the subsequent effect of local tissue hypoxia as a potential stimulus for hormonal secretions. In the past year, Hoffman has secured funding from Vitalstate and the National Strength and Conditioning Association.



The Center for Assistive Technology & Inclusive Education Studies (CATIES) is a research and service initiative dedicated to improving the educational experiences of children with disabilities. Under the direction of Amy Dell, the Center links on-campus faculty scholarship with the needs of New Jersey's disability community. CATIES provides professional development activities to school districts on the use of assistive technology to enhance teaching and learning, and strategies to support inclusive educational practices. TIES is a rich resource for faculty and students interested in studying the impact of assistive technology and inclusive education on children and adults with disabilities. In 2003, Co-PI's Bill Behre and Jerry Petroff were awarded a grant on behalf of CATIES from the U.S. Department of Education to support the Faculty Ambassador Project.
